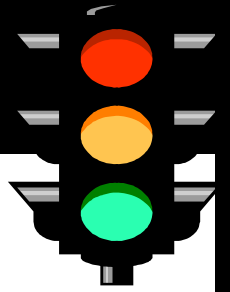
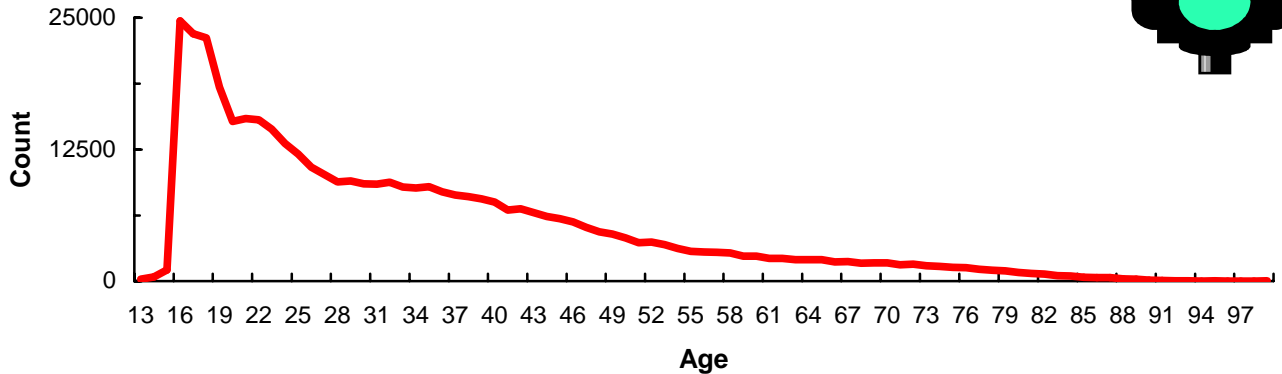

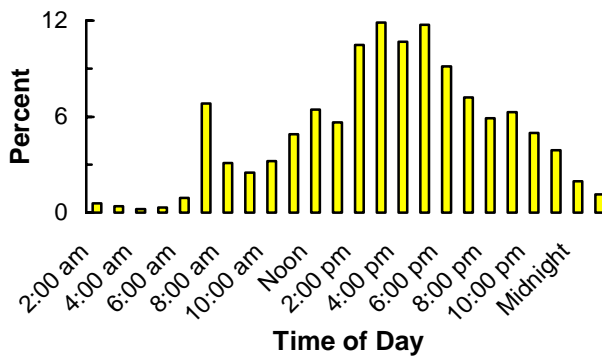


Number of Drivers Involved in Crashes by Age



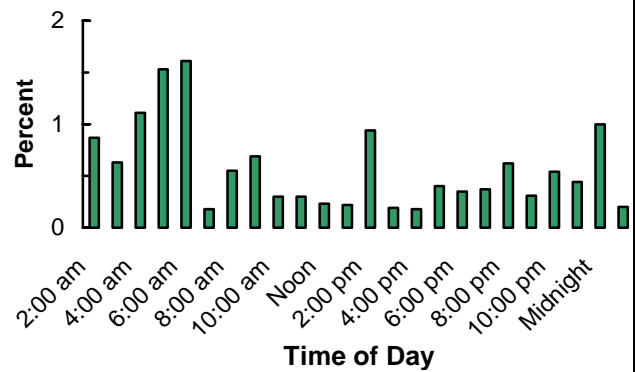
◆ 16- and 17-year old drivers were involved in the highest number of crashes.

Percentage of 15-17 Year Old Driver Crashes by Time of Day



◆ The percentage of 15-17 year old driver crashes peaked when these drivers were most likely going to school (7:00 am) and during after-school hours (2:00pm-6:00pm).

Percentage of 15-17 Year Old Driver Crashes that were Fatal by Time of Day



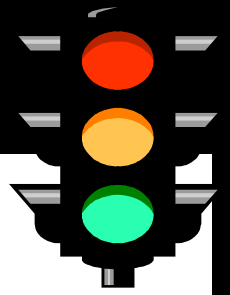
◆ If a crash occurred in the early morning (2:00 am-6:00 am), it was more likely to be fatal.

Citations Issued as a Result of a Crash

15-17 year old drivers were:

- ◆ Nearly twice as likely as other drivers to receive a citation
- ◆ More likely to receive a citation when all passengers were under the age of 21 years
- ◆ 2.5 times more likely to be cited for speeding when traveling with passengers than when driving alone
- ◆ Twice as likely to be cited for reckless driving when driving with passengers
 - ⇒ 6.5 times more likely when traveling with 4 or more passengers
 - ⇒ 2.5 times more likely when all passengers were under the age of 21 years

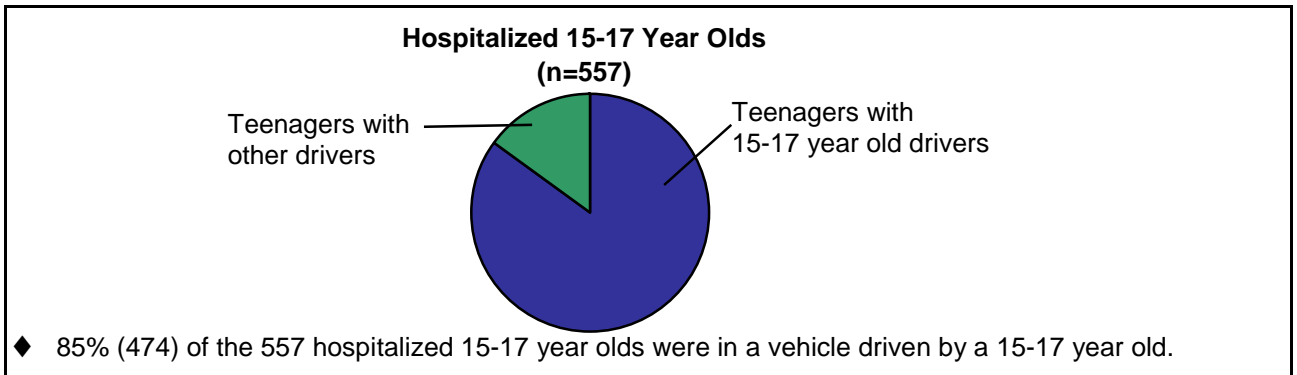


Seat Belts

- ◆ Self-reported seatbelt usage for 15-17 year old drivers was 78%, compared to 85% for other drivers.
- ◆ 15-17 year old drivers percent unbelted was 19% when driving alone.
 - ⇒ 26% when driving with 4 or more passengers

Hospitalizations

- ◆ Nearly \$10 million was spent on hospital charges in Utah for occupants of vehicles driven by 15-17 year olds.
- ◆ 15-17 year old drivers were 3.5 times more likely to have a crash that resulted in hospitalization when traveling with passengers than when driving alone.
 - ⇒ 5 times more likely when traveling with 4 or more passengers



Fatalities

- ◆ 15-17 year old drivers were 5 times more likely to have a fatal crash when traveling with passengers than when driving alone.
 - ⇒ 6.5 times more likely when traveling with 4 or more passengers
